Lack of space, big radiuses, and size of turnouts

Control systems – can't find many installed DCC locos. Note: Scott Mann puts in DCC.

Product availability – only a small part of Atlas's catalog is 2 rail. Lionel has no 2 rail in their catalog.

Expense – Joe B. doesn't think it O costs much more than HO.

Eric P. — He can run full passenger cars with 4 foot radius. Regarding control systems, Jim Canter runs DCC.

Conclusion: Visibility is the issue. People don't see 0-Scale 2 rail very much. Joe B. agrees.
